Beer History, Brews & Brats With author Michael D. Morgan Tuesday, April 30, 2019, 6 – 8 p.m.

Join GHP at Meritage, 40 Village Square, on April 30 for stories about local beer lore. The evening will include a tasting of four locally brewed beers and a German-style dinner buffet. Most folks don't know that Glendale was home to two Cincinnati brewers, Albert Lackman, who served on the Village Council, and John Kauffman, Jr., who was almost murdered.

Our speaker, Michael D. Morgan, is author of *Cincinnati Beer* (to be released April 2019), a history of the region's brewing industry from the 1700s to the current era, and *Over-the-Rhine: When Beer Was King*. Morgan's love of beer is deep. He founded the Bier Garten at Findlay Market, started the region's first historic brewery tours, and organized and built up the modern iteration of Cincinnati's Bockfest, a celebration of bock beer, which sustained German monks during Lenten fasts. Bockfest now attracts over 30,000 people from around the U.S.

Copies of the book will be available for sale and autographing at the event.



Attendance is \$30. Fee includes a tasting of 4 beers, buffet of hearty German fare, and \$10 tax-deductible donation to GHP.

Ohio History Fund

When you file your state tax return, remember to check-off a donation to the Ohio History Connection's History Fund. This fund provides competitive matching grants for historical societies for Bricks & Mortar projects, Organizational Development, and Programs & Collections.

Since 2012, when the History Fund started, it has made a total of \$598,000 in grants to 63 organizations in a third of Ohio's 88 counties. The History Fund has received 298 grant applications, totaling just more than \$3.6 million in requests. The more donations the Ohio History Fund receives, the more grants it can make for great history projects in our state.
