Street Signs Repainted

Maybe you noticed the workers at the end of your street, up on ladders. All of the village street signs and posts were given a well-deserved facelift this past summer as part of the latest project of Glendale Heritage Preservation.

This was the logical next step after the award-winning restoration and repainting of the gas lamps—a three-year effort by GHP and the Village.

The work was done the Glendale way—by volunteers—in partnership with Tom Alderfer and his Streets Department crew.

The group of GHP members fanned out around town to clean, sand, and paint all

85 posts and 160 signs on Village roadways, using supplies provided by GHP.
