


Town Hall Update

The Elevator and restroom project in the Town Hall is 99% complete! Construction has finished the construction of all their work, including building an elevator shaft, creating an entry point on the first floor, a beautiful wood structure creating receive the elevator upstairs, and completely updating both restrooms downstairs. state inspector recently required a phone and fire alarm system for the elevator and that is on order with Cincinnati Bell. installed, we can begin using the elevator. Just over \$7,000 is being retained (held back) from the contractor until we test and thoroughly inspect everything.

The new furnace and air conditioner project for the town hall is being referred to an HVAC engineer for design recommendations. The majority of the building is hot water heat and this creates several challenges. The fall is an excellent time to obtain competitive prices for this type of work and it is to our advantage.

Preservation News

Glendale Elementary Renovation Update - The Princeton Board of Education voted on Aug. 9 to proceed to schematic design for the renovation of Glendale Elementary. This vote comes nearly two years after the District first began the building campaign and is the result of significant work on the part of many in the Village. Site-specific teams of staff and community members will provide input to the architects and an initial design for both the interior and exterior of the building will be done. The Board expects to see the results of this schematic design at either the Nov. or Dec. Board meeting. Construction cost managers will also put together a cost estimate for this initial renovation design.

Last spring the Glendale team had commissioned a renovation design from the Columbus firm of McDonald, Cassell & Bassett that was estimated to

cost nearly \$1 million below budget. Based on this, we remain optimistic that the schematic design phase of the project will be successful.

Glendale residents should also be aware of the school attaining an 'excellent' rating. Many Glendale children are attending Glendale Elementary and benefiting from the variety of programs offered by the Princeton district.

Other Preservation News - Village Council recently passed an ordinance designating over 300 homes in the Historic District as contributing structures. This terminology is more consistent with historic districts across the country and national preservation organizations. Previously these homes had been referenced as 'background' structures. As in the past, all homes in the Historic District must review plans for any exterior change with the Glendale Planning and Historic Preservation Commission – there is no change in this procedure.
